

Snaith and Cowick Together

Approved Minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 24 October 2017 at The Council Offices Snaith

1. Apologies for Absence

Apologies were received from John Barrett and Geoff Thornton.

2. Approval of minutes of meeting held 8 August 2017

The Minutes were read and approved (proposed by Cath Hird and seconded by Nicola Russell).

3. Matters arising from minutes

There were no matters arising.

4. Correspondence

Sally Hulme was sent a reminder from the Town Council about the applications for grants. CH has applied for a grant for Heritage Day and GH has applied for a grant for the upkeep of the website.

5. Treasurer's report

GH reported that there is £500.60 in the Heritage account, £311.18 in the general account, and £257.62 in the SCGT account totalling £1,069.40

7. The Community Plan

NR reported that the TC is looking to secure funding to rejuvenate the Joint Use Play Area. Proposals from three providers have been showcased to local school children to consult over preferred equipment. It is hoped to secure funding early 2018 for installation in late Spring.

Two new litter bins have been installed in West Cowick (The Marshes and Ship Inn).

The Leader of Youth Club resigned over the summer. An internal applicant has been promoted to L2 leader and a new L1 Youth Worker appointed. Both will start their new roles on 9 November.

8. Reports from working groups

(a) Community and Leisure

The group has nothing to report.

(b) Transport, Town Centre, Accessibility and Community Safety

There was nothing to report.

(c) Heritage Day

CH gave a report on Heritage Day. Despite the rain, all went well. The report detailed all the events and monies made. Thank you letters have been sent out. The Wind Farm end of grant report is completed. A grant for 2018 has been made to TC but a decision is still to be made on application to the Wind Farm for a second year.

With this in mind, it is minuted that SCT authorise Cath Hird to make an application for Heritage Day 2018.

(d) Snaith and Cowick Growing Together

SH received a letter from SCGT outlining the progress so far and the future of the group. As the last meeting had only six people in attendance, a steady decline since the group was set up, and people who had offered to take a lead in areas have not attended meetings to give an update on their progress, a lengthy discussion ensued. The attendees agreed that all projects except the Crosshills regeneration should be postponed, and that SCGT does not have the manpower or resources to succeed as a sub group of SCT.

It was unanimously agreed to offer back SCGT to SCT.

SCT discussed the problem at length as to why this had happened after such a short length of time. CH proposed that the group be referred back to the TC as it was at their invitation that SCT took on the project.

SL to write to SCGT explaining that the constitution does not allow SCT to take on projects. Sub-groups carry them out; therefore the matter will be referred back to the TC for consideration at their meeting on 20 November. A copy of the letter will be sent to TC.

Also included in the letter is to be a request for outstanding invoices to be submitted, as the remainder of the grant given to SCT to set up SCGT will be transferred back to the TC, and that the stationery bought for the open meeting be returned to the TC Offices.

9. Website

There was nothing to report other than SL keeps the site up to date with information sent for the site. An invoice for £23.98 was given to GH for the upkeep of the domain name 'Snaith and Cowick Together.co.uk.'

11. Publicity

No publicity is required at the moment, although NR reported that Stephen Parnaby and Caroline Lacey from ERYC visited Snaith. They were given a tour of the town, and showed a display, and commented favourably on what they had seen.

12. Christmas Trees

Although a letter of invitation has not been received, displaying a tree in the Methodist Church was discussed and as no member could commit to putting the tree up, the idea was abandoned.
